after some goods, and apparently in good
health. He reached town all right, procured
his articles, and started on his return. When

road, and a friend just behind them told him
of this fact, but he answered, "I know what
I am about," and drove square into the
woods. His companion knew something
was the matter with him, and brought him
back to the residence of Dr. Jones, when
the best of medical attention was given him.
He died, however, soon after, and the doctors
pronounced it congestion. He had probably
had a chill or two on the way, which finally
ended in congestion. His remains were
taken home and there interred. He leaves
quite a family to mourn his sudden and
