On last Saturday, we understand that Mrs. Magdalena Faulhauber, a sister F. A. Stolsemberger, of Pilot Grove, died and was buried on Monday. It was rumored as a suicide, but the case, however, was not reported to the coroner, and we have no official facts of it.

Died, in Blackwater township, Cooper county, Mo., November 6th, 1883, Mrs. Elizabeth Case, wife of Samuel S. Case, in her 64th year. born May 27th, 1820, was married July 1st, 1838. She was a consistent member of the Methodist Church South nearly fifty years.

Charles Beard, formerly of this county, now of Tipton, was killed on Wednesday while working on a house at Tipton. From very meagre accounts, we only know as we go to press, that he fell from a house while working on it and was killed.

Probably the most important event of the week, of local interest, was the marriage, last Sunday night, of our friend Dr. W. W. Cleveland and Miss Hattie Franklin, both of this place. The wedding was a quiet one, there being no one present but the family and the officiating officer.—P. G. Bee
