"Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his saints." The sudden and tragic way he was summoned is a shock to us all, but we commend the wife and children to God for comfort and hope. He died in great peace though suffering and passed to his crown and reward Sunday evening Oct. 7, 1906, at about 7 o'clock, aged 71 years, 4 months and 22 days. Ripe with age divine in life and experience, hopeful happy but now crowned as victor.

His late pastor, Rev. J. C. Caughlin, now of New Sharon had charge of the funeral services assisted by Rev. Ross of the U. C. church and Rev. L. A. Crull, present pastor of the M. E. church. The mortal remains were laid to rest in the Moravia cemetery.
