### SLAIN IN LIBERIA.

Jackson Banks and wife, negroes, who a few months ago sold their farm in Pettis county and went to Liberia to engage in raising cotton for an English syndicate, were massacred together with a number of other imported negroes soon after their arrival there. The English had engaged Banks and others to act as overseers. The natives objected, believing it was a scheme to deprive them of their lands and the massacre followed.
