

J. S. M. HUFF DIED MONDAY

Member of One of Saline's Old Families;
Lived in Kansas City

Mr. J. S. M. Huff who was formerly teacher in the Marshall high school and superintendent of schools of Saline county, died in Kansas Monday. He had suffered an apoplectic stroke several days before and did not recover. He had been living at the home of E. W. Moore, for some time, and the funeral services will be held there. He was 60 years old at the time of his death.

John Sappington Marmaduke Huff was born near Good Hope and was brought up in the Baptist faith, being a regular attendant of the old Good Hope Baptist Church.

Mr. Huff early became interested in education, and for many years taught in the Marshall high school. His particular subject was mathematics. He also taught in the schools at Nelson and was later chosen school commissioner of the county. He served as superintendent of the schools of Saline county for some time.

He was an active worker in the Baptist church in Marshall. He was also a Mason.

About ten years ago, Mr. Huff moved to Kansas City. He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Verena Stephens Huff, niece of the late Lon V. Stephens, former governor of Missouri; a daughter, Mrs. Hardage L. Andrews, of Schenectady, N.Y.; two sisters, Mrs. Ben Gauldin near Gilliam, and Mrs. Betty Davis who lives in Montana. He was brother of the late Virgil Huff, who died in Marshall about four years ago.
