

DEATH OF MRS. E. A. CASE

Passed Away on Farm in Blackwater Twp. Monday, November 10.

Mrs. Elijah Case died Monday morning at her home in Blackwater Township, Cooper County, after a prolonged illness. Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon, at Salt Fork Church, the Rev. Dowdy, pastor of the Blackwater Methodist Church, having charge. Burial was in Salt Fork Cemetery. ✓

Mrs. Case, whose maiden name was Miss Cora C. Chamberlin, was born August 12, 1853, in Hampshire County, West Virginia, her home being near Capon Bridge. She was a daughter of G. E. and Martha Chamberlin. With her mother, one brother and one sister, she came to Cooper County in 1870, where she has spent practically her entire life.

She became the wife of Elijah A. Case October 24, 1872. To this union were born twelve children, eight of whom survive with the husband and father. They are Mrs. Allen Woolery and Mrs. G. M. Case, Kansas City; Mrs. Odlin Bruce and Elijah Case, Pettis County; Leslie Case, Saline County; Mrs. William Platt and Hugh and Rolland Case, of the home county. She also leaves two brothers, William Chamberlin, Pilot Grove, and Robert Chamberlin, Odessa, and two sisters, Mrs. Sarah Popkins, Odessa, and Mrs. Ida Helms, Kansas City.

Mrs. Case united with the Methodist Church at the age of 16 years in Virginia, later moving her membership to Ridge Prairie, where she has remained a faithful member until her death.

She was a fine Christian woman, and had friends all over the county, who regret to learn of her demise.
