

DEATH OF JAS. R. SAPP

Farmer of Mt. Hermon Community  
Died Monday Morning

James R. Sapp died at his home near Mt. Hermon church Monday morning at 11:30 o'clock, after being ill three years of diabetes. He was an invalid for a year and a half.

Funeral services, conducted by Rev. J. B. Bomar, of Tipton, were held at Mt. Hermon church, Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Interment was in the church cemetery by the side of his wife, who died Feb. 19, 1910.

Mr. Sapp, only child of Samuel Curtiss and Elizabeth Nelson Sapp, was born in North Carolina June 11, 1860, coming with his parents to Cooper county at the age of seven years and settling on the farm which he still owned at the time of his death. His father died when he was twelve years old, and his mother in 1888.

April 20, 1886, he was married to Miss Alice Rennison, and to this union three children, Olivia, Curtiss and Walter, who still survive, were born. He also leaves one grandchild.

When a young man he united with the Mt. Hermon church and remained a faithful member until death. He was also a member of the M. W. A. lodge. He was a successful farmer and well liked by all who knew him.
