MRS. JNO. CROSWHITE, 83, DIES MONDAY

~~AGED WOMAN HAD BEEN AN
INVALID FOR MANY YEARS~~

She Was Born in Cooper County
August 2, 1843.—Leaves Hus-
band and 3 Children

Mrs. John Croswhite died at
her home, near Pisgah, Monday
morning at 8:45 o'clock. She
had been an invalid for many
years, but was bedfast only six
weeks before her death.

Mrs. Croswhite's maiden name
was Miss Jamma Jane Hurt,
and she was born in Cooper
county August 2, 1843, the
daughter of Benjamin and Nancy
Emeline Hurt. At the time of
her death she was 83 years, 6
months and 27 days old.

On August 2, 1868, she was
united in marriage to John Cros-
white, and to this union were
born four children, two sons and
daughters. One daughter died
in infancy, and the other, Mandy
Elizabeth, died when 18 months
old. The two sons, T. C. Cros-
white, of Boonville, and William
Croswhite, at home, survive,
along with the husband. She also
leaves three grandchildren and
two great grandchildren.

Mrs. Croswhite united with
the Pisgah Christian church
August 16, 1885, and remained
a faithful member until her
death. She was a woman of fine
christian character and was
highly esteemed by all who knew
her. She bore her suffering
with patience and was cheerful
and loving to the end.

Funeral services were held at
Walnut Grove church Wednes-
day morning at 11 o'clock, Rev.
A. N. James, pastor of the Prai-
rie Home M. E. Church, officiat-
ing. Interment was in the Wal-
nut Grove cemetery.
