

Apoplexy is Fatal To John B. Renison

Cooper County Citizen, 74 Years
Old, Died Saturday Morning
At Home of Nephew

John B. Renison, 74 years old, died at 3:45 o'clock Saturday morning at the home of his nephew, Elmer Cartner, near Speed, following a stroke of apoplexy.

Mr. Renison was born August 4, 1856, near Longwood. He lived a few years in Fresno, Calif., and since returning to Missouri eleven years ago has made his home with Mr. and Mrs. Elmer Cartner. Mr. Renison was first married to Miss Liza Reno of Pettis County.

He later married Miss Jessie Pettit, who survives. He also leaves two sons, Ernest, Portland, Ore., and Virgil, Montgomery, Calif.; and a daughter, Mrs. Reba Brewer, of San Francisco; also two sisters, Mrs. Theodore Cartner, Speed, and Mrs. Rinda Land, Napton; three brothers, Richard, of Longwood; Ed, of Napton, and Charles, of Mulberry, Kans.

Funeral services were held Monday morning at 10 o'clock from the home of his sister, Mrs. Theodore Cartner, conducted by Rev. J. B. Bomar, Tipton. Burial was in Miller's Cemetery in Pettis County.
