

Mrs. J. S. Bane of Otterville Dies

Mrs. J. S. Bane died at her home in Otterville Saturday evening, April 4, after a long illness. Funeral services were held at the Presbyterian church in Otterville Sunday afternoon, conducted by the Rev. F. B. Smith. Burial was made in the Otterville I. O. O. F. Cemetery.

Mrs. Bane was born at Otterville Oct. 21, 1864, being 66 years old at the time of her death. She was married to J. S. Bane Dec. 1, 1886, at Otterville, where she has spent practically all her life.
