### Mrs. Henry C. Brown of Chouteau Dies

Paralytic Stroke Sunday Proved  
Fatal to Cooper County  
Woman

Mrs. Henry C. Brown of near Chouteau Springs passed away at her home Monday morning about 9 o'clock following a paralytic stroke suffered on the previous evening. Mrs. Brown had been ill for several years and recently from an attack of blood poisoning. She was thought to be improving nicely previous to her stroke.

Mrs. Brown was born near Cologne, Germany, July 28, 1867, a daughter of Henrietta and Frederick Schmidt. She came to the United States with relatives in 1877. She was married to Henry Brown on November 19, 1893.

Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon from the Nelson Memorial Methodist church of Boonville and burial was in the Walnut Grove cemetery. The services were in charge of the Rev. F. R. Ponge. Pallbearers were Rudolph Toennes, Clarence Runyon, Ed Bauman, Jacob Deck, Fred Vollrath of Pilot Grove, and Martin Johns.

The deceased is survived by a daughter, Mrs. John Simmons of Pilot Grove, a son by a former marriage, Henry Stretz, two brothers, Wilhelm, Schmitt and Fred Schmidt, both of Boonville, two sisters, Mrs. Emma Rentschler and Mrs. Will Hardwig of St. Louis, and seven grandchildren.
