James M. Nelson Dies In California

Brother of Mrs. Fred T. Renshaw
Passed Away Suddenly
Jan. 12.

Mrs. Fred Renshaw, of Boonville has received word of the death of her brother, James Mason Nelson, a former resident of Tirton, who passed away at his home in Long Beach, Calif., Jan. 12. He had been in poor health for some time but his death was unexpected. Funeral services and burial will be at Long Beach.

Mr. Nelson, son of Armistead and Maria Nelson, was born in Cooper County, and spent the early years of his life in this state. About thirty years ago he located in Long Beach, Calif., and had since lived there and at Venice, Calif.

Mr. Nelson was twice married, his first wife being Miss Olive Stetter of Tipton, who died in 1911. To this union were born two children, George Mason Nelson, of Venice, and Mrs. Stephen G. Long III, of Long Beach. His second wife, who also preceded Mr. Nelson in death, was Miss Florence Wornhall, of Long Beach.

Besides his children Mr. Nelson leaves a grandson, James Mason Nelson; his mother, Mrs. A. M. Nelson of Boonville, a brother and four sisters: E. T. Nelson, treasurer of the M-K-T Railway Company at Dallas, Texas; Mrs. R. F. Hare, Las Cruces, N. M.; Mrs. R. F. Bane, Dallas, Tex.; Mrs. M. L. Minor, Kansas City, and Mrs. Fred Renshaw, Boonville.

Mr. Nelson made an extended visit in Boonville several years ago and formed numerous friendships. He was a man of pleasing personality.
