

J. E. RENNISON DIES AT HIS HOME EARLY TODAY

Funeral Services Will Be Held at
Stegner-Koenig Funeral Home
Wednesday at 2 o'clock

J. Ed Rennison died at his home at 818 Spring Street this morning about 2 o'clock after having suffered from an illness of about two weeks. Death was attributed to pneumonia. The body will lie in state at the Stegner-Koenig funeral home until time for the funeral.

Services will be held at the Stegner-Koenig funeral home Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, conducted by the Rev. W. C. Brodersen, of the Baptist church. Burial will be in Walnut Grove cemetery.

Rennison was born January 1, 1864, on a farm in the Mt. Hermon community, the son of Sarah Cartner and James Rennison. He spent his early life on a farm south of Boonville. April 18, 1894 he was married to Miss Georgia Steele. The couple moved to Boonville a day after their marriage where Rennison entered the carpenter and contracting business with June Seat.

He worked at this occupation for a number of years, and then entered the insurance business with Dave Draffen. He was operating his own insurance business at the time of his death. He was a member of the Boonville Baptist church, having transferred his membership from the Mt. Hermon Baptist church when he came to Boonville.

He is survived by his wife, two sisters, Mrs. W. H. Steele, of the Mt. Hermon community, and Mrs. Florence Lewis, of Otterville; two brothers, Walter and Harvey, both of Otterville.
