← Mrs. Launa Edith Sayers died at the home of her sister, Mrs. H. L. Duscin, Tuesday, May 4, at the age of 69 years. She was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ephriam

Hull and was born near Good Hope, February 20, 1868. She was married to Samuel H. Sayers September 15, 1889, who died in the month of February, 1916.

She is survived by an adopted daughter of Dearborn, Michigan, two sisters, Mrs. L. H. Duscin and Mrs. Nettie Copeland of Slater and one brother, H. H. of Kansas City and a number of other relatives and friends.

At the age of twelve years, she united with the Good Hope Baptist church, and after moving to Slater in later years transferred her membership to the Slater Baptist church. Although unable often to attend the church services she was a member of the Home Department of the Sunday School and lived a good christian life.

The funeral services were held at the Baptist church Thursday afternoon at 2:30 conducted by the pastor, Dr. F. O. Criminger, and she was buried at the old Good Hope cemetery, where the husband, her parents and other members of her family are buried; many of whose lives were closely identified with the early history of the church.
