Walter J. Castle Killed in Crash

Walter J. Castle of Otterville met a sudden, tragic death about midnight Saturday at El Dorado, Ark., as he was enroute home-from-thestate of Louisiana with a truck load of cattle.

He also leaves three children, Walter E. Castle of Hunewell, Kas., Lawrence J. Castle and Miss Gertrude Castle of Otterville; and one sister, Mrs. Pearlie M. Balley of St. Louis.

The Castle family had lived in the Otterville community for the past seven years.
