

Mrs. Salmons Dies After Car-Truck Collision

Sedalia Woman Expires After Accident at Tipton

Mrs. Nadine Salmons, 57 years old, 1015 East Seventeenth street, was fatally injured about 6:10 o'clock Sunday evening about a quarter of a mile east of Tipton, when the car in which she was riding and a seven-ton United States government truck collided. She was brought to the Bothwell hospital where she passed away about 7:30 o'clock Sunday night.

The accident occurred when the 1932 Willys sedan in which she was riding with relatives and driven by her brother-in-law Oscar Schilb, 1402 East Tenth street, cut into the line of trucks and the rear fender was struck by the truck, "flipping" the car into the ditch on the right side of the highway and turning over several times. Mrs. Salmons was thrown out of the car and it is believed the car rolled over her.

The truck was driven by Albert E. Martin, civilian aviation mechanic from Patterson Field, Fairfield Air Depot, Fairfield, O., and was accompanied by Gilbert T. Adams of Troy, O. It was one of the tractor-type, six-wheel drive trucks, which are used by the United States Air Corps as gas tankers.

There were six trucks in the convoy which was in charge of Carl Weinfeld, of Dayton, O.

Dies of Injuries

pulled into the line of traffic too quickly. He said that Martin tried to pull the large truck to the right in an endeavor to miss the sedan, but the rear fender of the sedan struck the left front hub of the truck wheel and was "flipped" into the air. The damage to the truck was only a slight scratch on the wheel while the Willys was practically demolished.

Mr. Schilb was accompanied by Mrs. Salmons, their brother-in-law Herbert Solomon, 1807 West Broadway, Miss Bernadine Salmons, daughter of Mrs. Salmons, and Wilma Schilb, nine-year-old daughter of Mr. Schilb. They had been at Fulton visiting with Mrs. Schilb and were enroute back to Sedalia when the accident occurred.

Mr. Schilb received bruises about his forehead and slight lacerations. The injuries of Miss Salmons consisted of possible fracture of several ribs on the right side, slight cuts and bruises on her forehead and scalp, also slight lacerations and bruises about her body.

Mr. Solomon received a scalp laceration, abrasion of the right hand and left forearm and body bruises.

Wilma was shaken up and not seriously injured.

Two Ambulances Used

An ambulance from Tipton was rushing Mrs. Salmons to the hospital and when near the east Missouri Pacific underpass a tire on the ambulance blew out. The McLaughlin ambulance was hurried to the scene and took the injured persons to the hospital.

The convoy of trucks after an investigation was conducted at the scene of the accident, continued on to Sedalia and stopped here over night, leaving early today to continue to Kansas City to deliver the trucks.

Mrs. Salmons was born September 29, 1883, three miles west of Buncheon. She was married September 23, 1905 to Charles E. Salmons, at Clinton, Mo., and they came to Sedalia with their family from Clarksburg, about nineteen years ago.

Surviving Mrs. Salmons is her husband of the family home, and the following children: Miss Bernadine of the home; Sergeant Kirtley Salmons of Battery F., 128th Field Artillery, Fort Jackson, S. C.; Elliott Salmons of El Reno, Okla.; Thomas Salmons, of Springfield, Mo.; Mrs. Marie Smith, wife of Foster Smith, Norfolk, Va.; Miss Hilda Salmons of the family home. Another daughter Carmel passed away several years ago.

Also surviving is her mother, Mrs. Eliza Solomon, eighty-two years old, 1618 South Brown avenue, and the following brothers and sister, Jerry Solomon of Carlisle, Wyoming, Virgil Solomon of near Otterville, Herbert Solomon of 1807 West Broadway, and Mrs. Oscar Schilb of Fulton. Twelve grandchildren also survive. Her father, W. C. Solomon preceded her in death.

The body was taken to the McLaughlin Funeral chapel. No funeral arrangements will be made until word has been received from her children living at a distance.
