## Long Time Resident Here Dies At Home

Mrs. Eugene V. Saylor, 63, a native of this county, died at her home, 109 South First avenue, Monday night at 10:22 o'clock. She had been ill for five weeks but was bedfast only a short time. Death was due to a complication of diseases.

Mrs. Saylor was born Rosa H. Westcott Sept. 3, 1880 in Timber Creek township. She lived there until she was 13 years old. The rest of her life was spent in Marshalltown excepting four years when she lived in Fort Dodge and Oskaloosa.

She was married in 1906 to Binford Duncan who died Feb. 15, 1908. On Oct. 21, 1908 she married Eugene V. Saylor, who survives her. Four sons, Karel G. Duncan of Des Moines, Dr. Zelmer L. Duncan of Los Angeles, Calif., Dr. Burlen E. Duncan of Long Beach, Calif., and Clyde H. Saylor of Kansas City, Mo., also survive as does one daughter, Mrs. Lowell W. Moore of this city. Other survivors include a brother, Fred G. Westcott of this city, four sisters, Mrs. Mary Douth and Mrs. Laura Van Artsdalen, both of Independence, Mo., Mrs. Nellie Bailey of Des Moines, and Mrs. Bertha Hanson of Eagle River, Wis., and five grandchildren.

Mrs. Saylor was a member of the Royal Neighbors. Services will be held Thursday afternoon at 4 o'clock at the Pursel funeral home in charge of Rev. Arthur E. Cass. Burial will be in Riverside.
