Robert Jackson

Robert Jackson, former Sedalian, 36 years old, was found dead in his car about 5 o'clock Sunday afternoon, two miles southwest of Boonville. He was last seen about 1:00 o'clock Sunday morning, and his car was seen by a farmer who lived nearby early that morning. He thought it belonged to someone who was hunting in the vicinity. Later in the day when the car was still there he investigated and found Mr. Jackson dead. The Cooper county coroner stated that death was due to a heart attack. Mr. Jackson had been feeling ill for the past two weeks.

He was born in Saline county Mo., on October 23, 1910, the son of W. T. Jackson and the late Rachel Jackson. He came to Sedalia with his parents when he was five years old and grew to manhood here receiving his education in the public schools of this city. On August 4, 1942 he was married in Sedalia to Ester Eckhoff, who survives. He was inducted into the army on April 6, 1943, at Ft. Leavenworth, Kas., and was sent to Camp Hood, Tex. receiving his medical discharge two months later on May 27, 1943, following injuries received in a fall. After his return he went to Boonville where he has been employed by the Fraternal Order of Eagles as custodian.

Surviving are his wife, his father W. T. Jackson and one sister Mrs. Emmet Neal. His father and sister live in Sedalia. His mother preceded him in death on January 30, 1946.

Funeral services will be held at the Ewing funeral home this afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. Rev. Thomas Croxton, pastor of the First Baptist church to officiate.

Active pallbearers will be six friends from Sedalia and honorary pallbearers will be six members of the Fraternal Order of the Eagles.

The body is at the Ewing funeral home.

Burial will be in Crown Hill cemetery.
