## Illness Fatal To Oscar Spieler

Oscar Spieler died at the Hans Convalescent home at 5:05 a. m. today following an illness of several months.

Funeral services will be held at the Goodman and Boller Chapel Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock, conducted by the Rev. E. F. Abele, of the Evangelical Church, of which Mr. Spieler was a member. Burial will be in the Walnut Grove Cemetery.

The body will remain at the funeral home until time of the rites.

Mr. Spieler was born in Monticau County, near California, Mo., Aug. 21, 1870, the son of F. E. and Elizabeth Young Spieler. The family moved to Cooper County in 1873 and settled on a farm seven miles east of Boonville, later known as the Riverview Stock Farm. For many years Mr. Spieler was a widely known breeder of Spotted Poland China hogs.

He was the last of a family of nine children, and is survived by one niece and four nephews.

## Brother Of Local Man Is Dead

Alva W. Hurt, brother of Clarence L. Hurt of Boonville, died at 10:15 p. m. Monday in St. Louis. He had been ill for several days. He was an attorney.

Funeral services will be conducted at Kriegshauser's Funeral Home, 4228 Kingshighway, St. Louis, at 1:30 p. m. tomorrow.

Alva Hurt is survived by his widow of the home and the one brother.

He was born in the Ranklin's Mill community, March 30, 1883, the son of A. Willis and Emma S. Hurt. He attended Cooper County schools, the Gem City Business College at Quincy, Ill., and Washington University.

Mr. Hurt had made his home in St. Louis for about 40 years.
