Kelly Stone Dies At Home Here

Kelly E. Stone, a retired barber here, died at his home at 11:30 a. m. Sunday after an illness of more than three years.

Mr. Stone was born in Cooper county, Nov. 19, 1875, the son of Mr. and Mrs. William Henry Stone. He spent his early life here and then moved to Arrow Rock in about 1907 where he operated a barber shop for 20 years.

He was married to Miss Louise Townsend Dec. 23, 1908. The couple moved to Boonville in 1927, and Mr. Stone continued in the barber business here. He retired several years ago.

Survivors include his wife of the home; one son, Floyd Stone, three grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

Mr. Stone was a member of the Methodist church and Far West Lodge No. 4, I. O. O. F.

Social Security Slips Due For Farmers

Farmers are reminded that the 1957 annual social security wage reports for agricultural workers are due by Jan. 31, according to Thomas P. Nash, district manager of the Sedalia social security office.

All farm workers are covered who were paid \$150 or more in cash wages in 1957 by one farm employer, or worked for any agricultural employer on 20 or more days during the year where the cash wages were figured on a time basis — hourly, daily, weekly, etc. It is the employer's responsibility to report the wages and remit the social security tax on such wages to the Internal Revenue Service. This tax must be paid even if the employee is over 65 years or if the employee is getting a Social Security check each month, Nash explained.
