Mrs. Thomas Stull, 81, Dies at Home of Son

Mrs. Thomas Stull, 81, a Boone county resident for 64 years, died at 4:40 p.m. yesterday at the home of her son, Cecil Stull, 510 South Fifth street. She had lived at 902 Wilkes boulevard for 20 years before moving to her son's home upon becoming ill five months ago.

Mrs. Stull and her husband lived on a farm Southeast of here after being married in Cooper county on January 17, 1894. They moved to Columbia in 1927, and Mr. Stull died here January 14, 1948.

Born in Cooper county on September 7, 1877, Mrs. Stull was the former Miss Louellie Cary. She was a daughter of William and Ann Rennison Cary.

Besides Cecil Stull, survivors include another son, L. D. Stull, 503 Rogers street; a daughter, Mrs. Roy G. Parker, 717 Alton avenue; and 18 grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren. A daughter, a sister and two brothers also preceded her in death.

Services will be at 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon at Memorial Funeral home chapel, conducted by the Rev. Orlin McLean, pastor of the Seventh Day Adventist church. Burial will follow in the Little Bonne Femme church cemetery four miles South of here.

Pallbearers will be Edward Macy, Frank Farr, Allen Beckman, Thurman Stull, Ronald Stull and Earnie Petrich. The body will be at Memorial chapel until time for burial.
