Mrs. Luther Schriker Dies in Hospital

Became Ill While Visiting In Kansas City, Kan.—Funeral Services Saturday

Mrs. Luther P. Schriker died at 3:50 o'clock Thursday morning at St. Margaret's Hospital, Kansas City, Kan., after an illness of eight days. She was 48 years old.

Mr. and Mrs. Schriker, whose home is at 134 North Main Street, had gone to Kansas City, Kan., for a visit with relatives when Mrs. Schriker became ill and was taken to the hospital. She had been in failing health for several years.

Funeral services will be held Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Wilcox Chapel, conducted by the Rev. V. T. Wood. Burial will be in Sunset Hill.

Mrs. Schriker was formerly Bertie May Thomas, a daughter of Noble and Oda Smith Thomas. She was born January 25, 1893, in Johnson County. She married Mr. Schriker February 28, 1920, in Warrensburg, where they have lived since. She was formerly employed at the Brookfield-Garrison Manufacturing Company.
