J. E. Hayslip Dies in Columbia

Johnny Ellis Hayslip, 62, died Sunday evening at the Health Care Center in Columbia. Mr. Hayslip was a former Marshall resident.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Tuesday in the Wilkinson-Hershberger Funeral Home. Burial will be in Sunset Memorial Gardens.
