### GROVER TOLER

Grover Toler, 83, formerly of Prairie Home, and for the past 14 years a resident of Sedalia, died unexpectedly at his home late Wednesday night presumably as the result of a heart attack. Funeral services will be at 10:30 p.m. Saturday at the Prairie Home Methodist Church with the Rev. Louis Odneal and the Rev. Troy Gardner officiating.

Friends may call Friday afternoon at the Hornbeck-Thacher Funeral Home and until one hour before services, and then at the church.

Grover Cleveland Toler was born near Prairie Home on Aug. 9, 1888, the son of Jesse and Ella Oakman Toler. His first wife, Lillie Bybee Toler, preceeded him in death in 1935. He was married to Mary Burrus Crosswhite on Sept. 25, 1937, at California, Mo.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by a daughter, Mrs. O.T. (Virginia) Mooney of Raytown, and three grandchildren. He also leaves one brother, Joe Toler of Sedalia. Four brothers also preceeded him in death.

Mr. Toler was a member of the Prairie Home Methodist Church where he served on the board for a number of years. He also served as Mayor of Prairie Home for several years and was very active in the Prairie Home Fair Ass.
