He worked 10 years for the Missouri - Kansas - Texas Railroad and a number of years ago went into construction work.

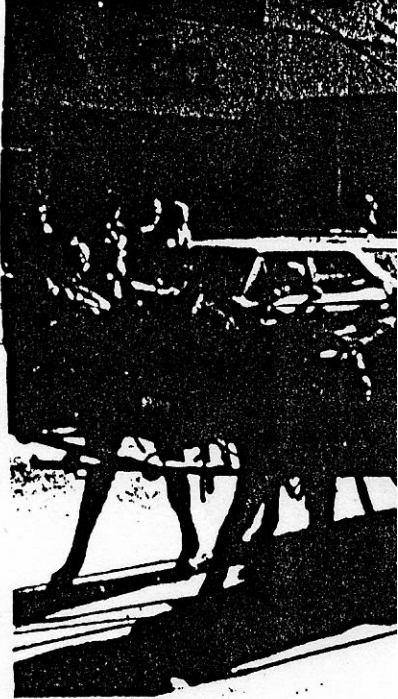
Mr. Young was a lifelong member of the St. Joseph Catholic Church in Clifton City and the Holy Name Society.
