Lula S. Carson, 78, of Otterville, died Saturday, Jan. 23, 1982 at Bothwell Hospital in Sedalia. She was born July 4, 1903 to David Madison and Rebecca Salmons Homan. On April 15, 1939 she married Charles Carson, who died in May 1976.

Mrs. Carson began teaching at the age of 16 and taught in public schools for 36 years. She was the elementary principal at Versailles for several years and retired in 1957. She then worked as a classroom teacher for Childrens Therapy Center in Sedalia until 1968. She is a retired member of the Missouri Teachers Association; a member of the National Teachers Association; and a member of the Ephrata Rebekah Lodge, where she was a Past Noble Grand. Mrs. Carson was also a member of the T.E.R. Sunday School Class, the Otterville Baptist Church, the Otterville Alumni, and the Otterville Senior Citizens.
