H.D. Quigg, Jr., 86

H.D. Quigg, Jr., 86, of New York, died at St. Vincent's Hospital in New York. Graveside services will be conducted at 2 p.m. Saturday at Walnut & Grove Cemetery in Boonville with Dr. Gary Reynolds officiating. Friends may call at the William Wood Funeral Home in Boonville from 11 a.m. until

1 p.m. Saturday.

H.D. Quigg was born Nov. 22, 1911, in Marshall, the son of H.D. and Elizabeth Craig Quigg, Sr. He married Mary Pauline Holoman in 1938. She preceded him in death. Mr. Quigg was a former reporter for United Press International. He covered two wars, man's landing on the moon and some of the biggest trials of the century in his 49-year career. He had interviewed Winston Churchill and Pope Pius XII and went pub-crawling with Errol Flynn. He joined Adm. Richard Byrd on his expedition to the Antarctic and visited with Gen. Douglas McArthur in the Pacific in World War II. Mr. Quigg grew up in Boonville and was nicknamed "Little Doc" because his father was a doctor. He was awarded the University of Missouri Honor Medal for distinguished service in journalism and received the New York Society of Silurians award for distinguished reporting in 1978.

Surviving is one daughter, Susan Quigg, of Ft. Lee, N.J.
