PREFACE

Clinton County was named for De Witt Clinton of New York, and its county seat, Plattsburg, for the seat of Clinton County, New York.

When it was created from Clay County in 1833, Clinton County included the territory now embraced in the counties of DeKalb, Gentry, and Worth, and a narrow strip of land later surrendered by Missouri to Iowa in the settlement of the border dispute. The counties of DeKalb and Gentry were attached to Clinton County for civil and military purposes until the organization of their respective county courts.

The western boundary of Clinton County remained the northwest border of Missouri until the state acquired in 1836 from the Sac, Fox, and Iowa Indians their titles to the land now known as the Platte Purchase. While the territory between Clay County and the Missouri River, designated as Platte County, was attached to Clay County until the Platte County court was organized in 1839, all of the Platte Purchase lying north of Platte County was attached to Clinton County until the organization of Buchanan County in 1839.

Following the pre-emption acts of 1838, 1840, and 1841, government land offices were established at Savannah and at Plattsburg, the latter office opening on April 1, 1843, with Col. James H. Birch, Sr., as Register and Edward Madison Samuel as Receiver. Through these offices titles were granted for much of the land in the Platte Purchase and in the counties formed from Clinton County.

While most of the pioneers were natives of Kentucky, Virginia, Ohio, Tennessee, and North Carolina, settlers from the eastern and New England states were also attracted to this newly-opened territory. In the period between 1840 and 1870 the population of Clinton County increased from 2,724 to 14,063, despite the loss of almost three-fourths of its original territory in the creation of other counties.

The Clinton County records are so well preserved and the county officials so hospitable and helpful that working in the county records there is an enjoyable experience.
