Russell was born on a farm east of Conway, Missouri, August 18, 1839, and lived there until the Civil war. He enlisted in the confederate army and served during the war. He was in the famous battle of Wilson Creek. His body was laid to rest in the uniform in which he served. Soon after the war he went south for the benefit of his health and lived in Texas and Louisiana for five years. April 7, 1866, he was married to Nannie G. Daniels of Farmerville, Louisiana. To them seven children were born, one of whom died in infancy. Six children survive and four of them, Mrs. John McKinney of Conway, Missouri; Mrs. Royal Corbett of Marshfield, Missouri; Mrs. F. M. Anderson of Marshfield; and J. E. Russell of Council Bluff, Iowa, attended the funeral. Mrs. G. H. He came with his family to Missouri about the year 1871, with the intention of going on to Kansas, but he decided to remain, in Missouri and settled first at Brush Creek, where he engaged, as a teamster for the railroad, which was then new. There his wife and child died. Soon afterward he came to Conway, Missouri and here also for a time he was employed by the railroad but later changed his occupation to that of farming. On July 3, 1876 he was married to Miss Frances Schmalhorst and to them two children were born; a son, Luther, who died about four years ago and a daughter, Mrs. Mattie Brooksbank, of Springfield, Missouri, who survives, and with her mother mourns his loss. Soon after his second marriage, Mr. Patterson purchased a farm about three miles southeast of Conway where he lived for many years. About five years ago he moved to Conway, Missouri and took control of the Conway Mill, of which his son Luther had previously been the owner. In early he united with the Presbyterian Church and for forty years has been a devoted and consistent member. He was a close student of the Bible, and was an appreciated and useful teacher in the Sunday School, where his place will be hard to fill. His close friends say of him that his good qualities as a man and Christian were best known to those who knew him best. His life was spent in upholding the Golden Rule, and in constantly striving to live up to its precepts. Being left an orphan at an early age, he was essentially a self made man, and his life furnishes an inspiring example of what a young man can do in overcoming circumstances and the shaping and forming of his own destinies. Mr. Patterson was a loyal friend and neighbor, a man who always kept his word, firm in his beliefs and adhering to all that is noble and good. Death had no terrors for him, as he said in his last hours that he was reconciled to its coming and felt that he was only "going home." 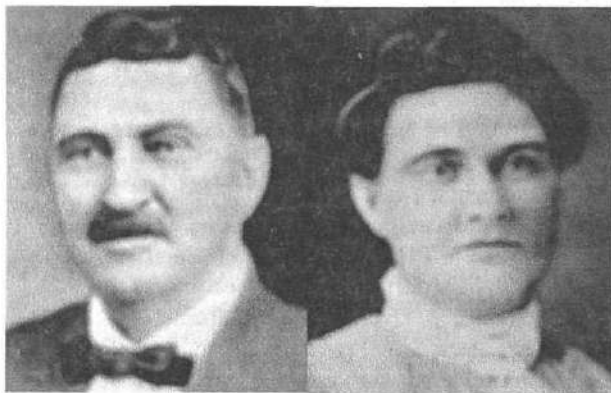

Schmalhores, was born in Westphalia, Germany, October 1825. He came with his parents to this country in 1839 and settled in Perry County, Missouri. On January 17, 1847, he was married to Miss Maria Isabel Whybark, and in April 1854, they moved to Laclede County, settling on a large farm, one mile from what is now Conway, Missouri. There he lived for almost sixty years and there he passed away. To Mr. And Mrs. Schmalhorst were born eleven children, six irls and five boys, all of whom are now living, except one son, Moses D. Schmalhorst, who died in St. Louis, in June, 1902. Mrs. Schmalhorst passed into the afterlife in July 1893. The surviving children are: Mrs. J.A. Durbin of Frisco, Oklahoma, Mrs. J.C.
