

PREFACE.

For submitting this Atlas to the public the authors make no apology, assuming that the need of such a work is recognized all over the county. It is believed that, upon fair trial, the work will prove to be a thoroughly reliable source of information regarding all matters that fall within its province.

A map that shows too much is as defective as a map that shows too little. Therefore, it has been the constant care of the makers that the plats that follow shall represent facts and situations as they actually exist, and that they shall be free from irrelevant and unnecessary details. To this end, the practice at all times has been to take nothing for granted, nor from hearsay. The following three sources of information have been constantly and solely relied upon: The abstract books in the law office of Roy & Hays; the deeds, plats, and surveys of the county on file in the recorder's office; a thorough personal examination in the field, made on foot and with appropriate instruments. In a number of cases it was found necessary to make special surveys. These the authors made at their own expense. The Reference-Index is a feature not generally found in works of this nature. It is hoped that this will prove to be of considerable practical value as a reliable and thorough-going directory, making easy and rapid the location of any place or parcel of land in the county.

For the benefit of those who may wonder at the name "Ohaha," the authors here volunteer the information that this is the first and proper name of what is now called "Salt River," it being the word by which this stream was known to the Sacs and Foxes, two Indian tribes which made their homes on its banks long before the coming of the white man. This name has been perpetuated in certain Spanish papers relating to grants of land in the territory through which this river flows.

Acknowledgments of obligation are due from the authors to the officials and the citizens of Ralls County who have cheerfully given them all the help in their power during the building of these maps.

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


Range 5 West of the 5th Principal Meridian








Range 7 West of the 5th Principal Meridian






Township 55 North of the Base Line Range 3 West of the 5th Principal Meridian


